giving her cookie up to a different guy from Poly.

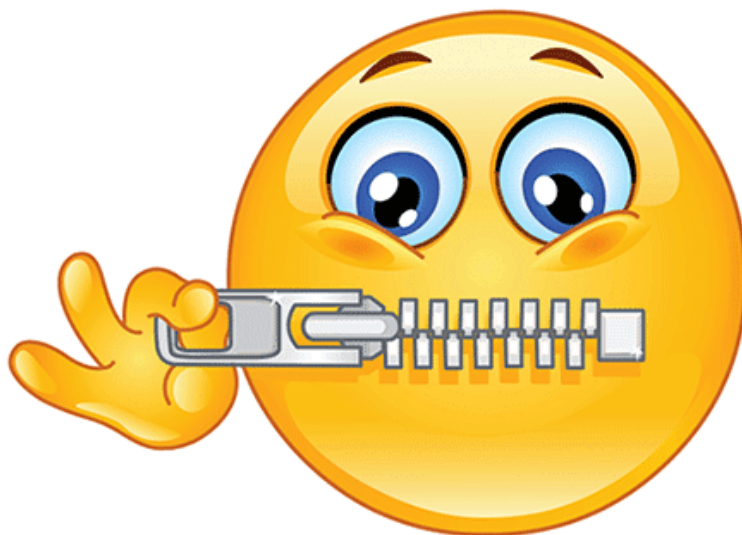
As we write this, the MCA guy is yet to get his hands on the Poly guy for smashing his girl.

Players pushing for more than 50K Pay

While players we watch on our TVs make thousands in dollars, millions in Kwachas, per week – some Malawian players are not even making more than 50K per month; and that's minimum wage.

The Football Players Union (FPU) is enforcing minimum wages (more than 50 Grand salaries) for players in the TNM Super League.

FPU's general secretary Ernest Mangani confirmed the issue – alleging that some stakeholders of the game are breaking labour laws.

“There are some clubs taking advantage of our players' ignorance. They draft contracts for our players in a very clever way, leaving the players miserable and poor,” he said.
