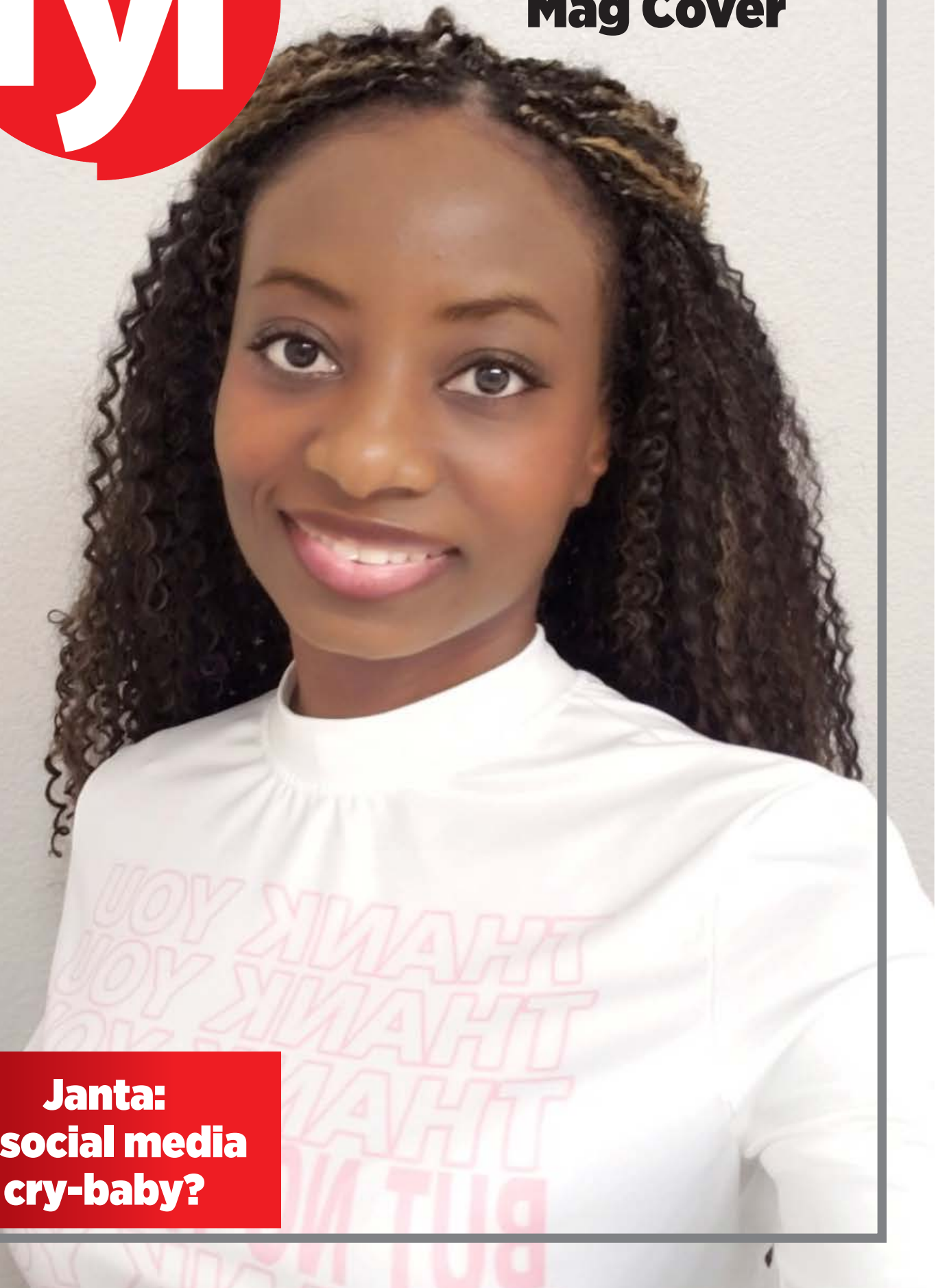

Poly Rape Case Court Progress

The case in which a police officer, Andrew Chagaga, is accused of raping a poly student while in custody at Limbe Police Station, started this week.

The girl, 17, testified in court in front of a group of people – despite the Magistrate giving her a chance to choose to testify without the group – against her alleged rapist.

However, a twist happened when the defense tried to play around with the rape survivor's credibility, by focusing on whether she was a virgin before the incident. She told the court she was, but a medical report says otherwise.

Regardless, Dr. Ruth Bvalani, a Queens Health Practitioner who the girl reported to after her ordeal, said the girl had a cut around her vagina – but no bruises.

A citizen witnessing the court proceedings said the way he sees it – anything can happen in court. He says there is a lot of drama going on in the court and despite his belief that the accused is guilty, he could walk away with it depending on how the case goes.

Well, we will see how it unfolds as the case has since been adjourned to 11 March.

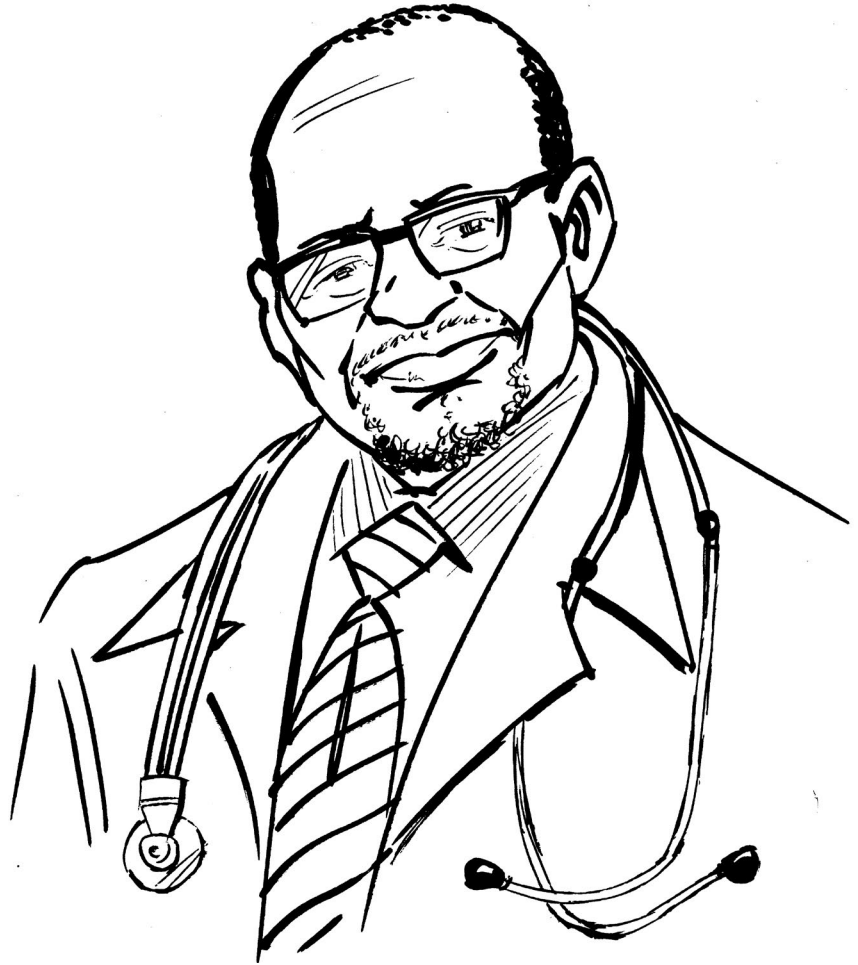

Cash Madam's fraud and money laundering case resumed this week, but its been adjourned to 22 Feb.

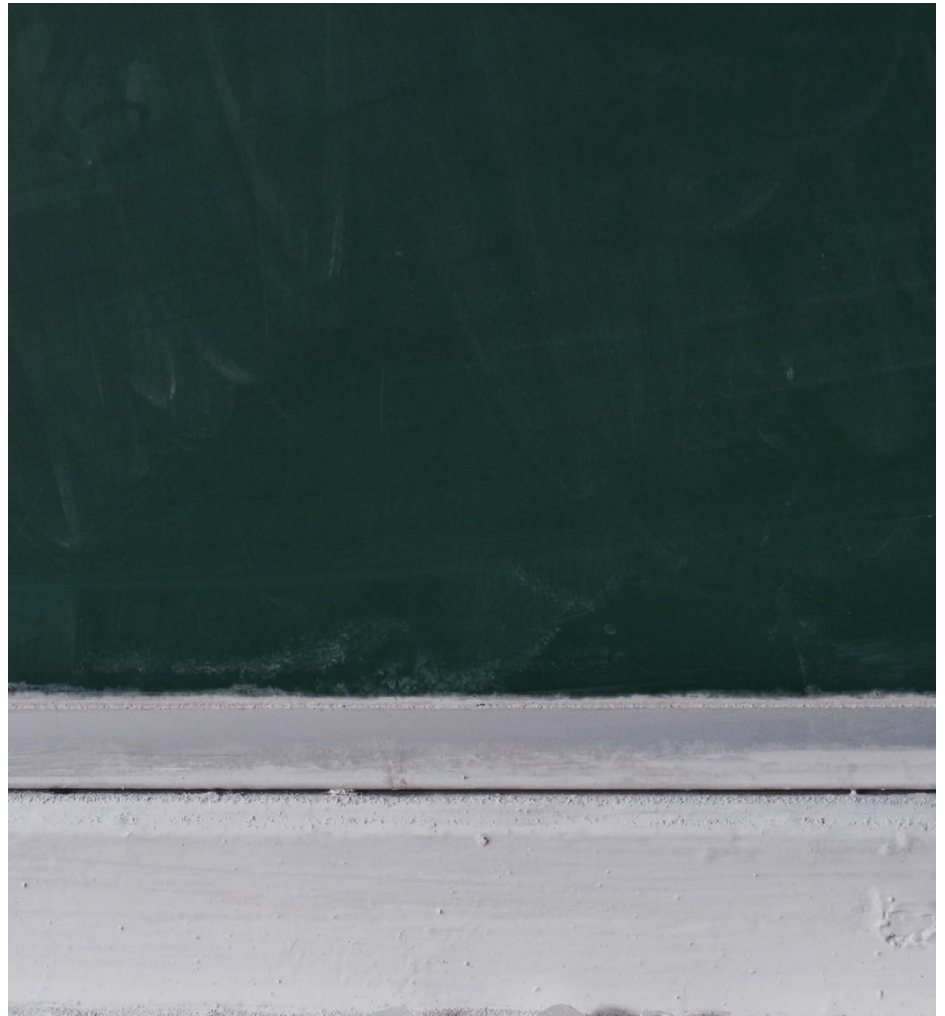
Woman dies at Lake Chilwa
